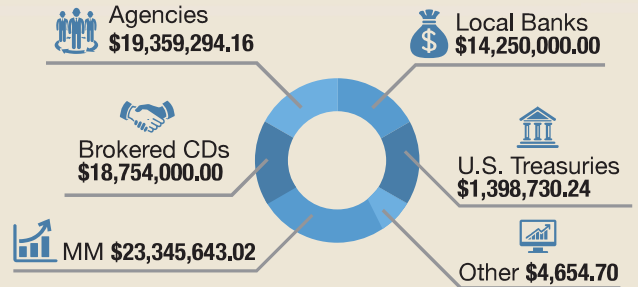

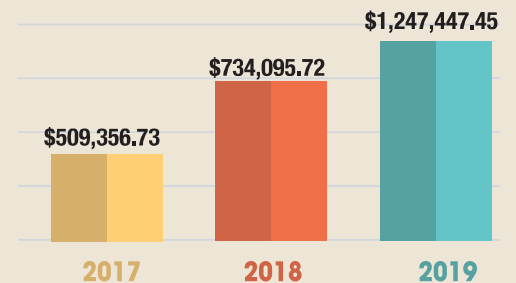
Property Tax Collection Rate
